We've just concluded a tough year; divisive elections, hurricanes, earthquakes, terror-

ism, and what not. The world feels as if it's shaking.

In times of uncertainty and divisiveness, the only thing we can do is be a beacon of light in an island of darkness. We can be the light that is sorely missing.

It can get discouraging and we may wonder "What is there I can do to make the world better? It's out of my control. The problems are too big, the disasters too vast to tackle."

That's where the power of one come in.

The Torah teaches that "Borcheinu Avinu Kulonu Ke'echad," G-d will bless us **like** we are one. The commentaries explain that it can be translated that G-d will bless us **when** we act like one, when there is unity amongst us. There is power in our unity. This holiday season, during both Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, the amount of congregants who assisted, whether it was from schlepping boxes, to helping out at junior congregations, airport runs, or ushering was enormous.

These people helped make things happen. And this is how it is supposed to be.

When a community unites, to accomplish together, G-d's blessings rain down upon them.

I am sure that G-d, seeing the wonderful unity and community feeling shown during the holidays and last few weeks will shower his blessings on us in the upcoming year. Let us continue in this vein throughout the year, working together to help each other, to bolster Judaism in this area and to become the community that G-d looks down on saying "These are my children of whom I am so proud."

In the spirit of unity, I hope to see you all on Sukkot and Simchat Torah where these themes of unity play out once again.

Each of the four species that we bless on Sukkot; the palm branch, citron, myrtle, and willow resemble another type of Jew. When we hold them together to bless them, we demonstrate the value of all different types of Jews being united.

On Simchat Torah, when we dance with specifically a closed Torah, we depict the Torah's availability to all regardless of level of knowledge or observance.

May it be a year of unity and joy!

JLI: GREAT DEBATES IN JEWISH HISTORY

Beginning Wednesday, November were the authors of the Dead Sea 1, at 7:30 pm, Chabad of Bradenton Scrolls opposed to rabbinic inter-& Lakewood Ranch will be offering a new six-session course from the Rohr Jewish Learning Institute, titled *Great Debates in Jewish History.* Were the authors of the Dead Sea Scrolls opposed to rabbinic interpretation? What motivated the rebels at Masada? And what is the Jewish perspective on taking up arms in situations where defeat is

Rabbi Mendy Bukiet will recount 2000 years of Jewish history through the lens of six epic debates that rocked the Jewish world and still resound powerfully today.

In commemoration of 70 years since archeologist Eleazar Sukenik purchased the first Dead Sea Scroll in November of 1957, the community is invited to examine and unlock the stories of these ancient manuscripts and what their texts reveal about the heated dispute between the Dead Sea Sect and the lewish establishment.

"Judaism welcomes debate and discourse," says Rabbi Mendy Bukiet. "This JLI course invites participants to gain fascinating insight into six mega-debates that have split the Jewish community throughout our history—and some of these matters continue to be debated today!"

Great Debates in Jewish History raises such questions as: Why were the authors of the Dead Sea Scrolls opposed to rabbinic interpretation? What motivated the rebels at Masada? And what is the Jewish perspective on taking up arms in situations where defeat is inevitable? What role does nationalism play in Judaism? Are faith and reason are mutually exclusive? What motivated the anti-Maimonideans in banning—and even burning—some of Maimonides's works? And is religion designed to be a private and personal experience, or one to be proudly paraded in the public domain?

"Our goal is to invite participants to seek out the rationale behind

headquarters. "In doing so, we hope to



unite the community around the very issues that have divided us for so long,"

Like all JLI programs, this course is designed to appeal to people at all levels of knowledge, including those without any prior experience or background in Jewish learning. All JLI courses are open to the public, and attendees need not be affiliated with a particular synagogue, temple, or other house of worship. 


