We are now in the month of Cheshvan which we call mar-bitter since that is the month in

which the flood occurred. The Torah tells the story of Noah and the flood.
Although some sages say that the story demonstrates Noah's greatness, most, especially these days, agree that this story shows Noah in a negative light.

In Noahide times, G-d became disgusted with the people of the world and decided to destroy it leaving just one family to perpetuate the human race.

When Noah heard G-d's plan, he found himself in a dilemma – how should he react? One way is to do what he actually did – accept the inevitable and begin building the Ark. The other option would be to do what Moses does later in history.

When G-d wanted to destroy the Jewish people for worshipping the Golden Calf and begin a new nation

with Moses. Moses, though, gives G-d an ultimatum, "Either forgive the Jews or kill me along with them."

Should Noah have challenged G-d and said – "No, it's all of us or none of us!" and risk the future of the world altogether? Perhaps he should have tried to save at least a part of the world so that it might continue to exist.

When G-d told Noah that he would be saved, Noah wasn't immune to the suffering everyone else would endure. He wasn't simply selfish, caring only about himself, Noah genuinely worried for the perpetuation of all of the world's species. Commentaries explain that for the entire year that Noah was in the ark, neither he nor his family had any sleep for they were constantly busy tending to the animals.

Noah worked so hard to keep the animals healthy that he himself became quite ill, often spitting up blood from the physical exertion. Noah dedicated himself entirely to the mission of saving the world. It was his sincere concern for the continuation of the world that did not allow him to take the risk that Moses took.

Life is full of dilemmas. For example, you want your family to become more observant, but you don't know if pressuring them will bring them to do more *mitzvahs* or will it backfire and turn them off from Judaism entirely. What does one do in such situations?

There is a saying that *Chassidim* wish each other at *Chassidic* gatherings: They say, "*L'chaim*, may our choices be in accordance with G-d's will."

This is a very telling blessing. There are always two ways a person can go and one can never be quite sure which way is the right way.

All we can do is pray and wish that our choices end up coinciding with G-d's will.


#### JLI - Great Debates in History
